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PCCP History

- Painting Contractor Certification Program
- Developed in 1994 at request of industry
- Focus to date on protection of steel & hazardous coating removal
- New activity area – pavement marking – 2008
- AustRoads backing

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Why PCCP accreditation?

- Mechanism for demonstrating professionalism & competence
- Combats misconceptions about the industry
- Independent third-party verification
- Uniform standards of competence across State borders
- National acceptance
- Improves the business

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Why pavement marking accreditation?

- Essential element of road safety
- Combination of Right Product (APAS) + Right Contractor
- Minimises variability between contractors
- Requested by road authorities
- Eliminates errors?

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Why pavement marking accreditation?



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Requirements for Accreditation

- Active, experienced pavement marking organisation
- A working quality management system
- An emphasis on OHS&E
- Properly skilled, trained & experienced operators
- History of satisfied customers

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Requirements for Accreditation – QMS

- A working quality management system based on ISO 9001
 - Quality policy
 - Quality manager
 - Control over purchasing, equipment, HR etc
 - Control over OHSE – JSAs, PPE, environmental records
 - Job review process – exposure to risk
 - Control over staff & sub-contractors – training in QMS, OHSE
- Documentation, records & evidence of the above
- More details in PCCP Document D033

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Classes of Accreditation

- Class 20 – line marking; major road works
 - Class 21 – line marking; minor road works
 - Class 22 – audio-tactile markings
 - Class 23 – car park markings
 - Class 24 – intersection & miscellaneous markings
 - Class 25 – raised pavement markers
 - Class 26 – high friction surfacings
 - Class 27 – pavement marking removal

Applicant actions:

- Visit the web site <http://www.apas.gov.au/pccp>
- Study Initial Application form F004 requirements
- Complete the form as appropriate
- Send to Executive Officer, PCCP
- Send application fee (\$950 + GST)

PCCP actions:

- Assess application
- Arrange for an audit
- Assess corrective actions &, if OK,
- Issue certificate

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Post-accreditation activities

Applicant actions:

- Continue to comply with all requirements
- Keep records & maintain documents
- Complete the Mid-Term desktop review
- Pay the annual fee
- Embrace continuous improvement

PCCP actions:

- Add contractor to web site listing
- Review Mid-Term review response
- Arrange for next audit (every 2 years)
