On reflection

The last RIAA National Conference was held in Dubbo, in August 2018.

The COVID pandemic, pandemic response strategies, and other global tensions, such as the situation in Ukraine, have combined to change the world and global economic environment in ways that were scarcely imaginable four years ago.

If it was imaginable, straight after Dubbo I would have purchased \$20,000 worth of shares in Zoom, and be sitting on a tropical island by now.

But above all, the chance for us to meet in person again, travel, and reconnect, at the RIAA National Conference, is a massive cause for celebration after the past few years.

Preparations for this version of the Conference began anxiously. After initially postponing and then cancelling the event in 2020, I applaud the courage of RIAA Directors who committed to holding the event this July.

One thing that's struck me right throughout the COVID pandemic, is how quickly peoples collective behaviour changes, and how quickly we forget events from just mere weeks ago. The best illustration is that out of seemingly nowhere, almost everyone became experts in epidemiology and totally at ease using previously unheard of phrases like "social distancing", "lockdown", "isolaton".

The reason I applaud the stance of the RIAA is that while the Conference is in July, and almost everyone who reads this is very aware that the Conference is proceeding, the timing of the RIAA committing to the Conference with no turning back was around December 2021 and January 2022. At that time, the new Omicron strain was dominating the headlines, and although the predominant judgement was that the surge would pass, at the time we committed to the Conference there was still uncertainty around lockdown and what borders would be open.

But RIAA Directors felt that the importance of the networking and learning opportunities created by our Conference where a step we had to take, even if attendance were to be limited to just a handful of Australian states.

And a note of acknowledgement and thanks to the amazing team at Opal Cove. If you are reading this at the Conference, its already apparent to you what a magnificent and beautiful venue the Opal Cove is. But above and beyond that, the team there have stuck with the RIAA and our Conference; and in turn, we have done the same for the teams at Opal Cove and Rowland Moye Entertainment (RME).

My personal experience with the RIAA has differed from my predecessors. As I approach five years in the role, the fates have dictated that this just my second National Conference. That and I've got at least a functional knowledge of how to use Teams, Zoom, Webex, and the other variations of those meeting platforms. I still clearly recall the anxiety as the RIAA opened its first collect virtual meeting. I decided to stick religiously to the "graceful swan" strategy. The graceful swan looks an image of calm above the water, but underneath the surface the legs are kicking wildly to stay afloat. So at that first virtual meeting, I smiled extra hard and spoke ever so slowly, all the time inwardly panic struck.

At least so far, unlike other professions, no pavement marking professional has appeared partially undressed in the background of a Teams meeting that I've been in. And from the pavement marking professionals that I know, I can assure you that's a very good thing.

So we arrive at Coffs Harbour, for the RIAA National Conference, with the industry in the midst of a range of difficult issues that were very hard to foresee. Many of us are looking forward, planning how to manage high demand for our services, high inflation in the short term, supply delays and difficulties, raw material shortages, lack of available labour, and cost pressure brought on by all the above.

And that's where the Conference comes in. A fresh and exciting array of speakers presenting the latest opportunities and industry developments, combines with a terrific response for delegate attendance from across the industry, and the natural beauty of Opal Cove and Coffs Harbour, to give us all a fantastic opportunity to renew acquaintances, celebrate making it this far, and start of planning and learning processes for the times ahead.

This was the theme for 2022 Yellow Ribbon National Road Safety Week (NRSW) and Safer Australian Roads and Highways (SARAH) was particularly honoured that these words should be reflected in this year's Road Safety Statement by His Excellency Governor General the Honourable David John Hurley AC DSC because the sentiment formed the foundation for the Week.

These words reinforce that fact that whether on, or beside our roads and highways, your safety, and that of your loved ones, friends and colleagues, is a fundamental human right... And that right can never be traded away for any reason.

Ensuring that everyone can "get home safe" represents an essential challenge to our governments, corporates, unions, business, and indeed, every member of our community, for it requires us to actively look after all those on the road ahead.

Indeed, the NRSW message that "Everyone has a right to get home safe" was all the more poignant this year, given that last November traffic controller Timmy Rakei was killed, while his colleague, Shaun Kilmartin was seriously injured in what was a completely avoidable crash in Carrum Downs, Victoria, virtually adjacent to the RIAA Offices.

SARAH dedicated the Week in memory of Timmy and in solidarity with Shaun and we thank the RIAA and the traffic management industry for its advocacy in remembering them.

In reflecting of the week itself, we are proud that the commitment to “Drive So Others Survive!” was seen across Australia with buildings, bridges, other icons lit in yellow, while metropolitan, regional and local events were held to garner organisational and community support.

While there are so many to thank for the outstanding promotion of the Week, it would be remiss not to mention the Government of Victoria and especially the Hon Ben Carroll MP, Minister for Roads and Road Safety for hosting the national launch in Melbourne, and of course, we gratefully acknowledge the Transport Accident Commission (TAC) for undertaking this year’s secretariat and coordination responsibilities.

I would also like to acknowledge the outstanding contribution of each of our Principal Partners including Altus Traffic Australia, Ennis – Flint APAC, Roads Australia, Australian Automobile Association, Volvo Cars Australia along with our Gold Partners, Traffic Management Association of Australia, Mix Telematics Australia, 3M ANZ and SG Fleet. I also acknowledge the support of the jurisdictional Ministers and government partners including:

- » Hon Scott Buchholz MP, Former Assistant Minister for Road Safety and Freight, and the Commonwealth Office of Road Safety;

“The statistics tell us we have a long way to go. The number of Australians killed each year, on average, for the last 10 years is 1,200. More than 400,000 have been seriously injured in the last decade alone. We simply must do more to reduce this toll and prevent the pain inflicted on families.

It is incumbent on all of us who use the road to conduct ourselves in a considerate and responsible way to ensure the safety of those around us. I want to commend all involved in 2022 National Road Safety Week for highlighting the issue of road safety and for promoting ways to help reduce the incidence of road trauma.”

Pavement markings were invented in the early 1900's serving a very specific purpose and have since evolved to denote hundreds of different things and in many different sections of the road.

Starting with paint, it was quickly realised that the durability and performance were not adequate. Over the next few decades new materials and application methods were developed to improve the situation and although the durability has improved, performance is still considerably far behind. Testament to that is the fact that not only roads need to be restriped every so often, but even when markings are fresh on the road they may not always be visible, especially under adverse weather conditions. Higher performance and durability come hand in hand with improved visibility and safety on the road.

3M will be sharing the results and thoughts from a 2021 trial in Melbourne to study the optical performance and durability of high performance wet reflective ceramic beads versus conventional glass beads.
